


# Sauvignon blanc Strassertal

About the vineyard: This wine comes from the Gaisberg mountain plateau which faces South and to the North is protected from behind by Manharts Mountain. The soil consists of weathering conglomerate. Its altitude and the mighty conifers covering Manharts mountain expose this location to great variations in temperature, which in turn have a very favourable effect on the excellent aroma of these wines.
